The *Nathan of Dorchester* is proud to serve as floating ambassador for the City of Cambridge and Dorchester County. The *Nathan* provides adults and children with the opportunity to sail a skipjack, learn about days long gone, and hear stories of how skipjacks and oysters played an important part of life on the Eastern Shore and the Chesapeake Bay. The *Nathan of Dorchester* is a very active boat. Commanded by a U.S. Coast Guard licensed captain, a well-trained volunteer crew of four and a docent she sails about 100 days each season. Each year the *Nathan* carries over 1,500 passengers of all ages on sailing and oyster dredging trips from Long Wharf in Cambridge and from other ports on the Chesapeake Bay.
